Habitat Network Map

We have carried out a habitat mapping project, across the whole of the LNP area, helping us to focus conservation work on sites where we can have the most positive impact on wildlife.

The map is free to use. It can be used to identify anything from possible habitat enhancement opportunities on a particular farm holding, through to supporting landscape-scale funding bids.



Haymeadow restoration

Our area hosts most of the UK's upland hay meadows which are the jewel in the crown of the farmed landscape. Unfortunately, these species-rich meadows have become very rare.

We have developed a new website that brings together advice and guidance on how to restore and manage these valuable sites.



Curlew conservation

Our area is one of the last strongholds for curlew in the UK.

We are developing a new programme of work to drive the recovery of curlew numbers.

As a first step, we are:

- working with land owners and managers to highlight good current practice, and
- creating a network of advisors who can give advice and support.



High Nature Value Farming

We are helping local farmers and environmental agencies to collaborate in ways that will secure a more robust economic future for the low intensity, upland farming systems that are particularly valuable for wildlife, the environment and people.

We helped to secure a national trial of a new results-based approach to agri-environment funding in Wensleydale. We are launching a Hill Farm Training Scheme to help Conservation Professionals get a better understanding of hill farming.
